Cardiac and Pulmonary Rehabilitation is a specialized program aimed at improving the health and wellness of individuals that have either heart or lung disease. This department also offers periodic smoking cessation classes. *Medical provider referral required*.

Cardiac Stress Lab The Cardiac Stress Lab provides cardiovascular testing and screening services. A cardiac stress test measures how the heart performs in response to exercise or stress; and are often performed to help determine the cause of chest pain or shortnessof-breath. Stress tests also help diagnose narrowing of the heart's blood vessels, which is indicative of coronary artery disease. *Medical provider referral required*.

Chronic Care Management (CCM)

The CCM program consists of non-face-toface services provided to Medicare beneficiaries who have multiple. significant chronic conditions expected to last a year or longer, and who are at risk of death or functional decline. The program assists patients with: assessing needed health services; coordinating care; enhancing selfmanagement skills, health behaviors and compliance with a plan of care; and maintaining health and functioning. Inpatient Hospice Care

KHC's hospice care includes:

- General Inpatient Care for persons with pain or symptoms that cannot be managed successfully at home.
- Respite Inpatient Care for hospice patients when primary caregivers need a break, which is normal and often necessary for the physical and emotional well-being of the caregiver.
- **Final Care** for patients who are unable to remain at home during the last days of life.

Inpatient hospice care services are arranged in coordination with the patient's outpatient hospice care provider and primary care provider.

Nuclear Medicine

Nuclear Medicine is a medical imaging specialty that is used to diagnose and treat diseases in a safe and painless way. Nuclear medicine refers to a drug that is attached to a small quantity of radioactive material (a radioisotope). Common nuclear medicine imaging include scans of the brain, breast, bone, gastrointestinal system, heart, liver, gallbladder, bile ducts, kidney, and thyroid. *Medical* provider referral is required.

Sleep Disorders Clinic

The Sleep Disorders Clinic sees adults and pediatric patients with conditions and symptoms that include obstructive sleep apnea, narcolepsy, parasomnias, periodic limb movements in sleep. seizures in sleep, and other sleep disorders. The clinic offers home sleep tests and nocturnal polysomnography (overnight monitoring of a patient's sleep at the Sleep Lab). Test results are analyzed by the clinic's Medical Director, Melisa A. Transitional Care Management (TCM)

TCM nurse case managers plan, facilitate and coordinate care to prepare patients (and their families) for discharge from the hospital and into the patient's community setting (home, assisted living, long-term care, etc.). TCM commences upon discharge and continues for 29 days. TCM is comprised of face-to-face and non-face-to-face services, such as patient education, medication reconciliation, and assistance in scheduling any required followup with community providers and services.
